NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF PRE-APPLICATION INTERVENOR FUNDS AND DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING FUNDING REQUESTS

(Issued April 2, 2019)

Any person interested in filing an application to construct a major electric generating facility in New York must first file a Preliminary Scoping Statement (PSS) with the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (the Siting Board). On April 1, 2019, Morris Ridge Solar Energy Center, LLC (Morris Ridge), an indirect subsidiary of EDF Renewables, Inc., filed a PSS in connection with a proposal to construct the Morris Ridge Solar Energy Center Project (the Project), a solar energy facility that would generate up to 177 megawatts, to be located on approximately 1,350 acres of leased private primarily agricultural land, in the Town of Mount Morris, Livingston County, New York. Project would include solar photovoltaic generating panels, access roads, medium voltage transformers, inverters, a medium voltage collection system, a substation, a point of interconnection switchyard, a temporary laydown area and possibly an Operations and Maintenance building. The Project would interconnect with the New York State Electric and Gas Corporation's existing 230 kilovolt South Perry - Meyers transmission line.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that funds are available to eligible municipal and local parties to participate in this proceeding. With its Preliminary Scoping Statement, Morris Ridge submitted the required intervenor fee of \$61,950 to be used to defray legal, consulting witness, and administrative costs for the pre-application scoping phase of this proceeding. At least 50% of the funds must be reserved for potential awards to municipalities.
