Economic Impact



The Palen Solar Project is a 500-megawatt solar photovoltaic (PV) facility located on 3,478 acres of BLM administered vacant land in Riverside County. The Palen Solar Project will produce lasting benefits not only for California's renewable energy supply but also for the entire regional economy. This project will create thousands of good-paying jobs, generate significant state and local tax revenues, and bring additional economic benefits to the region by spurring job creation in other industries.

Long-Term Job Creation and Economic Benefits

The project will employ a full staff for at least 30 years of operation, generating a total of roughly \$19 million in direct employee compensation (including benefits).



The project's construction and operation will generate \$318 million in positive indirect local economic impacts over 30 years. Project spending will produce positive

multiplier effects on the surrounding economy, such as additional rounds of spending by businesses in the project's supply chain and increased household spending by new project-related employees.
